

Part-Day California State Preschool Program (CSPP)

serves eligible 2, 3 & 4-year-old children in an age & developmentally appropriate subsidized early learning & care program.

Child Enrollment Priorities for 5% of funded enrollment:

5% of CSPP funded enrollment is reserved for Children with Disabilities. To extent possible, enroll in income ranking order. If 2 or more families have the same ranking, enroll the family with earliest application date first. **Note:** Only child in family with disabilities may be enrolled under this eligibility criteria.

Child Enrollment Priorities for 95% of funded enrollment:

First: Child is recipient of Child Protective Services or At-Risk of being neglected, abused or exploited. Enroll 3- & 4-year-olds before 2-year-olds.

Second: Once the set-aside is filled, 3 & 4-year-old children with disabilities from income eligible family. Prioritize based on income ranking order.

Third: Eligible 3 & 4-year-old children not enrolled in Transitional Kindergarten. Prioritize children with the lowest income ranking first.

If 2 or more children are within the same ranking prioritize dual language learners, then based on the child who has been on the waiting list for the longest time.

Fourth: Eligible 2-year-old child. Prioritize children with the lowest income ranking first.

If 2 or more children are within the same ranking prioritize dual language learners, then based on the child who has been on the waiting list for the longest time.

Fifth: Family income is not more than 15% above income threshold (limited to 10% of funded enrollment excluding children with disabilities). Prioritize as follows for only 3- & 4-year-old children:

- 1) Child with disabilities in income ranking order
- 2) Children with lowest income ranking first

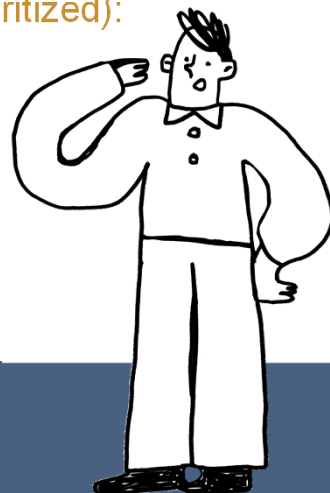
Note: If 2 or more children are within the same ranking, admit the child who has been on the waiting list for the longest time

Sixth: Family resides in approved Neighborhood School Boundary. Prioritize based on income ranking order. Enroll 3 & 4-year-olds before 2-year-olds.

Seventh: Children enrolling in CSPP to provide extended learning & care to Transitional Kindergarten or Kindergarten pupils (must meet an eligibility criteria)

Non-Prioritized Families (after all applicable families have been prioritized):

- 1) Children with disabilities from families with income above 15% of the income threshold who were not enrolled within the set-aside.
- 2) 2-year-old children that are eligible and not listed in the above priorities.

Admission Priorities for 5% of funded enrollment:

5% of CSPP funded enrollment is reserved for Children with Disabilities. To extent possible, enroll in income ranking order. If 2 or more families have the same ranking, enroll the family with earliest application date first. For full-day programs family must also meet a need criteria.

Note: Only child in family who has disabilities may be enrolled under this eligibility criteria

Admission Priorities for 95% of funded enrollment:

First: Child is recipient of Child Protective Services or At-Risk of being neglected, abused or exploited.

Second: Once the set-aside is filled, children with disabilities from income eligible family AND family meets a need criteria. Prioritize based on income ranking order.

Third: Eligible children not enrolled in Transitional Kindergarten AND family meets a need criteria. Prioritize children with the lowest income ranking first.

If 2 or more children are within the same income ranking prioritize dual language learner, then based on the child who has been on waiting list for longest time.

Fourth: Family income is not more than 15% above income threshold AND family meets a need criteria (limited to 10% of funded enrollment excluding children with disabilities). Prioritize as follows:

- 1) Child with disabilities in income ranking order
- 2) Children in income ranking order

Note: If 2 or more children are within the same ranking, admit the child who has been on waiting list for longest time

Fifth: Family meets eligibility criteria, but does not meet a need criteria. Prioritize children with the lowest income ranking first.

Sixth: Family resides in approved Neighborhood School Boundary. Prioritize based on income ranking order.

NON-PRIORITIZED FAMILIES

(after all applicable families have been prioritized)

- 1) Children with disabilities from families with income above 15% of the income threshold who were not enrolled within the set-aside, AND family meets a need criteria.

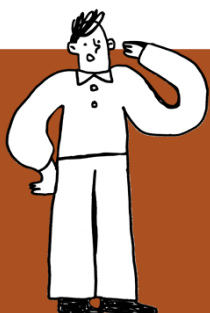

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Second: Once the set-aside is filled, 3 & 4-year-old children with disabilities from income eligible family AND family meets a need criteria. Prioritize based on income ranking order.

Third: Eligible 3 & 4-year-old children not enrolled in Transitional Kindergarten AND family meets a need criteria. Prioritize children with the lowest income ranking first.

If 2 or more children are within the same income ranking prioritize dual language learner, then based on the child who has been on waiting list for longest time.

Fourth: Eligible 2-year-old child AND family meets a need criteria. Prioritize children with the lowest income ranking first.

If 2 or more children are within the same ranking prioritize dual language learners, then based on the child who has been on waiting list for longest time.

Fifth: Family income is not more than 15% above income threshold AND family meets a need criteria (limited to 10% of funded enrollment excluding children with disabilities). Prioritize as follows for only 3- & 4-year-old children:

- 1) Child with disabilities in income ranking order
- 2) Children with lowest income ranking first

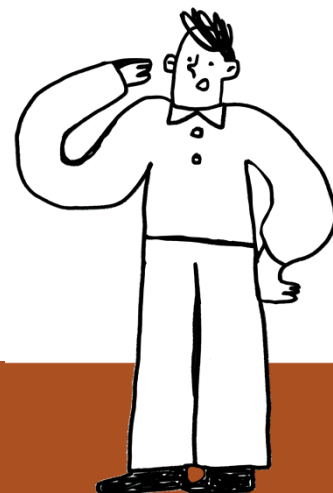
Note: If 2 or more children are within the same ranking, admit the child who has been on waiting list for longest time

Sixth: Family meets eligibility criteria, but does not meet a need criteria. Prioritize children with the lowest income ranking first.

Seventh: Family resides in approved Neighborhood School Boundary. Prioritize based on income ranking order. Enroll 3 & 4-year-olds before 2-year-olds.

Non-Prioritized Families (after all applicable families have been prioritized):

- 1) Children with disabilities from families with income above 15% of the income threshold who were not enrolled within the set-aside, AND family meets a need criteria.
- 2) 2-year-old children that are eligible and not listed in the above priorities AND family meets a need criteria.



Programa Preescolar Estatal de California (CSPP) de Día Completo

atiende a niños elegibles de 2, 3 y 4 años de edad en un programa subsidiado de aprendizaje y cuidado temprano apropiado para la edad y el desarrollo

Prioridades de admisión para el 5% de la matrícula financiada:

5% de la matrícula financiada por CSPP está reservada para niños con discapacidad. En la medida de lo posible, inscriba en el orden de clasificación de ingresos. Si 2 o más familias tienen la misma clasificación, inscriba primero a la familia con la fecha de solicitud más temprana. Para los programas de día completo, la familia también debe cumplir con un criterio de necesidad. **Nota:** Solo el niño en la familia con discapacidad puede inscribirse bajo este criterio de elegibilidad.

Prioridades de admisión para el 95% de la matrícula financiada:

Primero: El niño es beneficiario de Servicios de Protección Infantil o corre el riesgo de ser descuidado, abusado o explotado. Inscriba a niños de 3 y 4 años antes que a niños de 2 años.

Segundo: Una vez que se llena la reserva, niños de 3 y 4 años con discapacidad de una familia elegible por ingresos Y la familia cumple con los criterios de necesidad. Prioriza según el orden de clasificación de ingresos.

Tercero: Niños elegibles de 3 y 4 años que no están inscritos en el Kínder de Transición Y la familia cumple con los criterios de necesidad. Priorice a los niños con la clasificación de ingresos mas bajos.

Si 2 o más niños están dentro de la misma clasificación, priorice a los estudiantes de dos idiomas, entonces, según el niño que ha estado en la lista de espera por más tiempo.

Cuarto: Niño de 2 años elegible Y su familia cumplen con los criterios de necesidad. Dar prioridad a los niños con los ingresos más bajos, clasificándolos en primer lugar.

Si 2 o más niños están dentro de la misma clasificación, priorice a los estudiantes que aprenden en dos idiomas, entonces, según el niño que ha estado en la lista de espera más tiempo.

Quinto: Los ingresos familiares no superan el 15% del umbral de ingresos Y la familia cumple con los criterios de necesidad (Limitado al 10% de la matrícula financiada, excluyendo a los niños con discapacidades). Priorice de la siguiente manera solo para niños de 3 y 4 años:

- 1) Niños con discapacidades en orden de clasificación de ingresos
- 2) Niños con los ingresos más bajos ocupan el primer lugar

Nota: Si 2 o más niños están dentro de la misma clasificación, admita al niño que ha estado en lista de espera durante más tiempo

Sexto: Familia cumple con los criterios de elegibilidad, pero no cumple con criterios de necesidad. Priorice primero a los niños con los ingresos más bajos.

Séptimo: La familia reside en el límite escolar del vecindario aprobado. Prioriza según el orden de clasificación de ingresos. Inscribir a niños de 3 y 4 años antes que a niños de 2 años.

FAMILIAS NO PRIORIZADAS (después de que se haya priorizado a todas las familias aplicables)

- 1) Los niños con discapacidades de familias con ingresos superiores al 15% del umbral de ingresos que no estaban inscritos dentro de la reserva, Y cumplen con los criterios de necesidad.
- 2) Los niños de 2 años que son elegibles y no figuran en las prioridades anteriores Y la familia cumple con los criterios de necesidad.
